Catalog Course Description:

This introductory course is designed to prepare students to be effective oral communicators in all aspects of public presentations, including design and delivery of a public speech. The course is appropriate for all students interested in developing their public speaking knowledge and

skills, such as speech communications and languages majors, future teachers, and future business leaders.

A general discussion board is open to all topics that can be initiated by students. Students also have access to contact the instructor through canvas inbox and a mobile text messaging service.
