We understand it was an act of workplace violence and not random in nature. Although the suspect remains at-large, there is no ongoing threat to the general public. Our thoughts go out to the victim who remains in critical condition.

While Río Hondo College remains a very safe place, we must all remain vigilant against any public safety issues that could disrupt our campus and educational centers or endanger our students, faculty, or staff. To this end, we are reviewing and refining our safety protocols, and the newly established Campus Police and Safety Department is in the process of expanding and ramping up its capabilities. We encourage every member of the Río family to become familiar with all available campus emergency response plans, fully participate in emergency preparation drills, always remain aware of your surroundings, and immediately report any suspicious activity. **IF YOU SEE**SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING!
